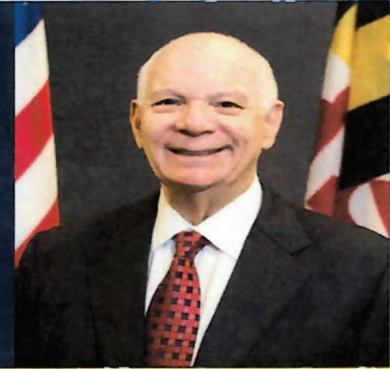

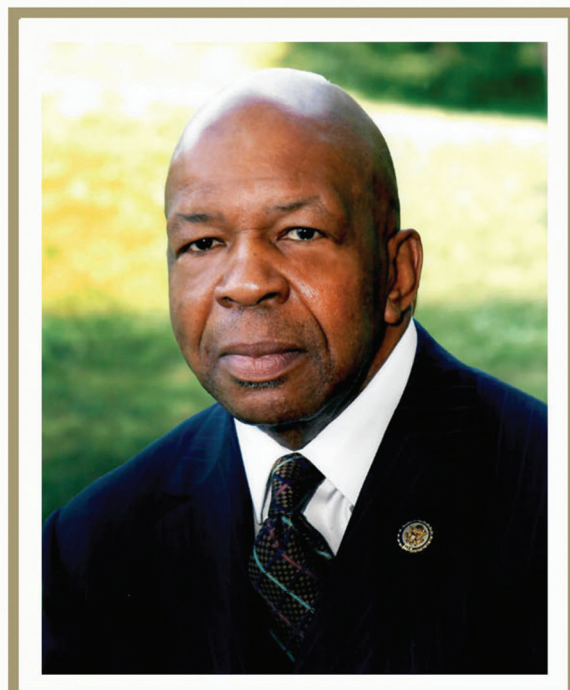

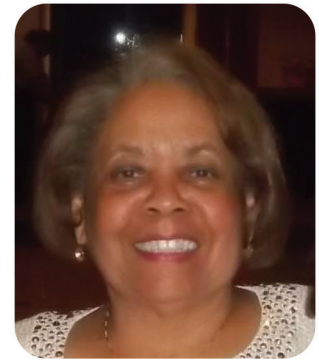

Meet the President

Dr. Iantha Tucker

Dr. Iantha L. Tucker attended the Baltimore City Public Schools, received the R.N. from Harlem Hospital School of Nursing, the B.S. and M.S. from Morgan State College and the Ed. D. in Dance Education from New York University. She served as a registered nurse in the United Air force Reserves from (1962 to 1972). She began her fortyone year tenure at Morgan State in 1972, from which she retired in 2013, as an Associate Professor in the Department of Health, Physical Education, Recreation and Dance. She was the Artistic Director and Principal Choreographer for the Modern Dance Ensemble at Morgan State University from 1976 to 2013.



Dr. Tucker is a noted dance historian and sought-after speaker on the African American Influence in dance in the United States and has presented papers on Black Dance History at the Smithsonian Institutions, Museum of American History, the Black College Dance Exchange, and at various Colleges and Universities. She has presented papers on Dance at Historically Black Colleges and Universities at the International Association of Blacks in Dance Conferences. Dr. Tucker has acted as judge for dance competitions sponsored by the Baltimore City and County Public Schools, the NAACP, Howard County Public Schools and various fraternal, religious and other organizations. She has choreographed for local, regional and national organizations as well as the United States Armed Forces Morale Support Unit. She is a member of the Board of Directors of the Talking Drum: The Black Dance Newsletter, co-writer of the State of Maryland curriculum Framework for Dance in Public Education, a member of the Maryland State Department of Education Task Force for the Arts in Education, a member of the Society of Dance History Scholars, a member of the International Dance Council (CID-UNESCO), and the Howard County Arts Council.

She is the recipient of numerous awards and commendations from the Mayor of the City of Baltimore, the Governor of the State of Maryland, the United States House of Representatives and other local and regional organizations, for her service to Morgan and the community. She was one of 14 recipients of the Fulbright Hayes Fellowship for summer study in West Africa. She has been named one of the most influential African Americans in Howard County, Maryland. She was the artistic consultant to the Alvin Ailey Summer Dance Program held at Morgan State University, Vice President and three-time President of the Howard County Chapter of the Morgan State University Alumni Association, as well as Second Vice President of the MSU National Alumni Association. Iantha Tucker was named Alumnus of the Year at Morgan State University in 1992 and Distinguished Alumnus by NAFEO in 1993.

Her publication, "The Role of Afro-Americans in Dance in the United States from Slavery to the Present" is distributed through the VRI Slide Library of Dance History. Iantha Tucker is co-founder and Past President of the Black College Dance Exchange, the national coalition of dance companies from Historically Black Colleges and Universities. She was the 1999 recipient of the Maryland Council for Dance Award for her contributions to dance and has been nominated by the Howard County Arts Council for its annual Outstanding Arts Educator award. Dr. Tucker was the 2003 recipient of the Living Legend Award presented by the International Association of Blacks in Dance at the annual conference in Washington, D.C. In 2003, she was also awarded the Disney Corporation's highest award, "the Mouscar" for her contributions to the dance.

In October 2006, she was awarded the Pioneer in Dance Award by the Dynamic Dance Festival in Atlanta, Georgia. In November 2006, she received the Baltimore Dance Treasure Award from Dance Baltimore. She was also recognized for her contributions to dance by the Dean of the School of Education and Urban Studies through the Outstanding Achievement Award in the fall of 2006. In November 2017 the dance studio located in Hurt Gymnasium was named "The Dr. Iantha L. Tucker Dance Studio".

She is the owner and president of Protocol Works, LTD., an event planning and choreographic services company.

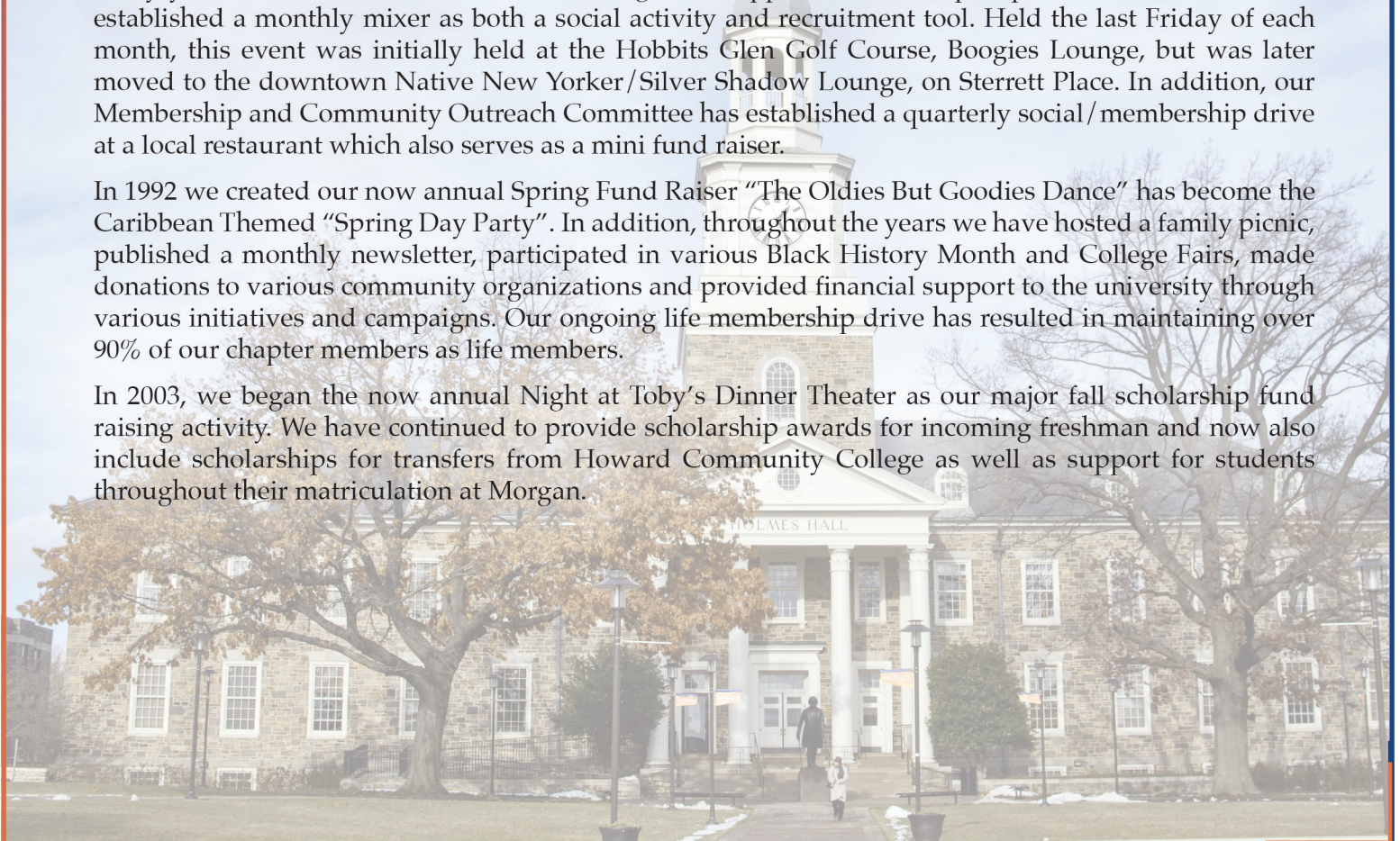
A HISTORY IN PERSPECTIVE

The idea of the need for or interest in having an Alumni Chapter in Howard County came, as a part of a conversation between Allan Wilson, of Baltimore and newly transplanted Howard County resident Robert Sturtevant. As a result of this conversation, and with the encouragement of Virginia Coleman, a member of the Baltimore based Howard Cornish Chapter, Robert Sturtevant approached other friends who had expressed a desire to establish a Howard County Chapter with the growing group of Morgan Graduates living in the Columbia, Howard County area. The other residents of Howard County who expressed an interest in establishing a new chapter in the Howard County area included Edgar Johnson, Bill Tyson and Edward Brooks. The word quickly spread and the number of interested people quickly grew. Our first informal meetings were held at the home of Pamela and Edgar Johnson. By March 1987 the interest group had moved to the Florence Ban Center, where we continued to meet for several years. The fledgling group had its first official meeting in May 1987 with Lawrence Montgomery, Director of Alumni Affairs, Dr. Earl S. Richardson, then President of the University and Virginia Coleman, of Howard Cornish Chapter, in attendance. We received our official charter on May 20, 1989. The group continued to grow and only moved from the Bain Center, across the parking lot, to Kahler Hall, because of extensive renovations that were being made at the Bain Center. We continue to meet at Kahler Hall on the first Monday of each month.

Our first of many fund-raising activities, a racquet ball party at the Supreme Court Racquet Club in Owen Brown Village, was held in 1988. In December of 1990, the chapter became the first University affiliated organization in the State of Maryland to enter into a partnership with a Board of Education (Howard County). Our optimal goal for this partnership, was to support the county wide Black Student Achievement Program. In June of 1990, our newly established scholarship award was presented to graduating seniors from Howard County schools. In that same year our resident artist, Walter Carr, created our unique logo and designed and produced our t-shirts, hats and jackets which we have proudly worn for many years. Our motto "Let's Give Something Back" appears on all chapter published materials. We established a monthly mixer as both a social activity and recruitment tool. Held the last Friday of each month, this event was initially held at the Hobbits Glen Golf Course, Boogies Lounge, but was later moved to the downtown Native New Yorker/Silver Shadow Lounge, on Sterrett Place. In addition, our Membership and Community Outreach Committee has established a quarterly social/membership drive at a local restaurant which also serves as a mini fund raiser.

In 1992 we created our now annual Spring Fund Raiser "The Oldies But Goodies Dance" has become the Caribbean Themed "Spring Day Party". In addition, throughout the years we have hosted a family picnic, published a monthly newsletter, participated in various Black History Month and College Fairs, made donations to various community organizations and provided financial support to the university through various initiatives and campaigns. Our ongoing life membership drive has resulted in maintaining over 90% of our chapter members as life members.

In 2003, we began the now annual Night at Toby's Dinner Theater as our major fall scholarship fund raising activity. We have continued to provide scholarship awards for incoming freshman and now also include scholarships for transfers from Howard Community College as well as support for students throughout their matriculation at Morgan.
