Chartered on May 20, 1989, the Howard County Chapter currently has a membership ranging in graduation years from the 1950's to 2018. Many chapter members have not only continued their education to obtain certifications and master's degrees, but the chapter has several members that have obtained doctorates.

Scholarships

Education is important to the Howard County Alumni Chapter and awarding scholarships to assist Howard County students in furthering their education is a major goal. The chapter has yearly fundraisers to raise money for scholarships. These fundraisers have enabled the chapter to award several thousand dollars to students who are residents of the Howard County community.
